Job Description:

The Forest School Specialty Summer Camp Guide will work with our new one week camp programming for youth ages 8-12 at Glendalough State Park.

Position duties include:

- Helping to oversee up to 21 campers along with other camp staff
- Assisting with all camp activities and projects (planned by Camp Director)
- Supporting a positive, engaging atmosphere for camp participants
- Providing positive guidance and conflict resolution assistance with campers while navigating social interactions with others in the group

Qualifications

This position requires a blend of qualifications including knowledge and experience working with youth, a love of the outdoors, and a sense of adventure. Candidates should possess curiosity, if not deep understanding, of our local ecosystem with a commitment to helping our learners develop place-based natural knowledge through camp activities. Candidates should be



comfortable working 100% outdoors (indoor space is available during air quality alerts and thunderstorms). A positive, learner-centered approach to classroom management aligns with our organization's values.

Our ideal candidate will:

- Be passionate about educating children in nature.
- Honor our learners as individuals capable of risk-taking, problem-solving, creativity, teamwork, inquiry, and self-awareness.
- Be self-motivated and self-directed with the flexibility to work independently and collaboratively as part of a team.
- Have excellent interpersonal skills, organizational, and time management skills.
- Feel comfortable and confident about meeting the needs of children outdoors in all seasons - physically able to hike and carry gear.

Preferred Experience and Education:

- Have experience working at a camp, school, or licensed child care center with elementary-aged learners
- Possess or in pursuit of a bachelor's degree in education, outdoor education, environmental studies, or related field.
- Knowledge of and passion for place-based learning including local ecosystems, flora, and fauna.
- Experience/knowledge in the areas of positive behavior management, emergent curriculum, outdoor learning, play-based learning, process art, coyote mentoring.
- Maintain current First Aid/CPR certification
- Must pass background check before start of employment
